**RE: PERMISSION TO REMOVE PROTECTED PLANTS FROM AREAS TO BE DEVELOPED: CONSTRUCTION OF GREENFIELDS ROAD SECTIONS: WILD COAST TOLL HIGH WAY: PERMIT NO. CRO 151/16 CR**

You are hereby granted a permit in terms of **Nature Conservation Decree, 1992 (Decree No. 9 of 1992, former Transkei)** to remove plants listed in the Tables on pages 13 to 15, and any additional species found subsequent to this survey, of the report *Plant Search and Rescue Plan: N2 Wild Coast Toll Highway, Eastern Cape* from areas to be developed during the construction of the above mentioned road, to appropriate areas that will not be developed as prescribed in terms of Condition 6.2.12 of the Environmental Authorization 12/12/20/701 dated 19<sup>th</sup> April 2010, as amended.

**Note the following conditions:**

1. Approval is granted on condition that all the conditions of the Environmental Authorization Notice Register Number 12/12/20/701 dated 19<sup>th</sup> April 2010), including those requiring of additional information, are met.
2. All Threatened or Protected Species located within the footprint of the development, as identified by a botanist, must be relocated. This implies that an Application form must be completed and the prerequisite Processing Fee paid. The documentation must be submitted to the Department of Environment Forestry & Fisheries; Contact persons: Zizipho Madyibi [ZMadyibi@environment.gov.za](mailto:ZMadyibi@environment.gov.za) and Ephraim Makhubele [EMakhubele@environment.gov.za](mailto:EMakhubele@environment.gov.za)

**No ToPS Species may be relocated before a permit is issued.**





3. Any temporary nurseries must be established within the development foot print and as close as practically feasible to the construction areas. Any plants that are kept temporarily in the nurseries must be used for rehabilitation purposes.
4. If the species are represented by too many individuals to make relocation of the entire population feasible, plants should be taken from different parts of the site and from different habitats. Both young and old individuals should be selected as well as any individuals reflecting variability in the population (for example flower or leaf size) to ensure that translocation will express the broadest genetic variation and the plants will have the maximum chances of survival.
5. Persons or organizations responsible for the relocation of the species must work ahead of the clearing team, locate and relocate individual plants.
6. Plants identified for relocation within the sites must be physically removed before vegetation clearing starts.
7. Translocations must not only be restricted to whole plants but also include seeds, bulbs and cuttings. No plant parts will leave the province for Botanical gardens without a permit.
8. Private individuals, traditional healers and/ or nurseries should be given the opportunity to collect plants that will not be relocated (in other words, they will be destroyed) but need to get a permit first from the Department.
9. Lists and numbers of all species collected together with their GPS coordinates must be forwarded to this office on a three months basis.
10. The permit is valid until **06 September 2022** and it must be returned to this office within fourteen days of the expiry date.
11. Issuing of further permits will depend upon the fulfilment of the above conditions. Failure to adhere to the above conditions may lead to cancellation of this permit with immediate effect.
12. The Department have a right to add or change any condition above to protect environment.
